NATIONAL GALLERY PROJECT - A CREATIVE TRIUMPH

Last year, pupils in Years 3, 4 and 5 at Queenborough Primary School and Nursery took part in an exciting nationwide competition hosted by The National Gallery in London—and we were thrilled to be announced amongst the winners! As part of the prize, our students' work was proudly displayed in the iconic gallery's Take One Picture exhibition over the summer months.

To bring our winning submission to life, The National Gallery visited our school and collaborated with thirty pupils to transform their ideas into an immersive augmented reality experience.

During the workshop, children imagined and designed a futuristic Al world for their sculptures to inhabit - blending creativity. technology, and storytelling in truly inspiring ways. Several pupils were even interviewed about their artistic iourney and what it means to be featured in one of the world's most renowned galleries.

Across the Trust, we're incredibly proud of the imagination, teamwork, and dedication shown by every child involved. This is a moment of celebration not just for our school, but for the power of art and innovation in education.


